

Spanish Film Festival: The Liberator (El libertador)

The Spanish Film Festival continues with *The Liberator* (*El libertador*) on Sunday, March 5, at 7:30 p.m. in the Science Auditorium. Rising Venezuelan actor Edgar Ramírez stars in this biopic of one of Latin America's greatest figures. Simón Bolívar fought more than 100 battles against the Spanish Empire in South America. He rode more than 70,000 miles on horseback. His military campaigns covered twice the territory of those of Alexander the Great. But his army never conquered—it liberated. The most expensive Latin American film ever produced, *The Liberator* is a riveting portrayal of the man who led Venezuela, Colombia, Panama, Peru, and Ecuador toward independence.
