

"Imaging Don Quixote: Cervantes and His Bodies"

Ryan Prendergast, associate professor of Spanish at the University of Rochester, will present "Imaging Don Quixote: Cervantes and His Bodies" on Thursday, November 9, at 4:30 p.m. in Humanities Fine Arts 6. Prendergast holds a PhD in Spanish literature from Emory University. His research focuses on the literature and culture of early modern Spain, with a special emphasis on Don Quixote as well as 17th-century theater. He is the author of *Reading, Writing, and Errant Subjects in Inquisitorial Spain* (Ashgate 2011). His current book project, *In the Shadow of Cervantes*, explores the formation of the Spanish classical literature canon by analyzing the significance of non-canonical literature eclipsed by Cervantes's now world-famous novel and his other works of prose. This event is co-sponsored by the Spanish Discipline and student organizations Sigma Delta Pi and Vamos Juntos. It is free and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served.

Soup and Substance: The Politics of Healthcare

The third Soup and Substance of the semester, the final event in a three-part health series, will be held on Thursday, November 9, at 6 p.m. in Oyate Hall, Student Center. 




