NATIVE VOICES: NATIVE PEOPLES' CONCEPTS OF HEALTH AND ILLNESS EXHIBIT

Native Voices: Native Peoples' Concepts of Health and Illness opens at Rodney A. Briggs Library on Wednesday, February 27, 8 a.m., main floor. Native Voices explores the interconnectedness of wellness, illness, and cultural life for Native Americans, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians. Stories drawn from the past and present examine how health for Native People is tied to community, the land, and spirit. Through interviews, Native People describe the impacts of epidemics, federal legislation, the loss of land, and the inhibition of culture on the health of Native individuals and communities today. The U.S. National Library of Medicine (NLM) developed and produced Native Voices: Native Peoples' Concepts of Health and Illness. The American Library Association (ALA) Public Programs Office, in partnership with NLM, tours the exhibition to America's libraries. The exhibit runs through April 10.
