

Matt Bombyk: "What Every College Graduate Needs to Know about the Labor Market in Minnesota"

Matt Bombyk '10, senior research analyst at the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED), will give a lecture on the work of the Labor Market Information Office, the section of DEED for which he works, along with a little bit about his current work there on Thursday, October 6, at 7 p.m. in Humanities Fine Arts 6. Items covered will include DEED's "labor market outcomes" analysis, which tracks employment and wages of all college graduates in the state by major, and the occupational profile tool that identifies characteristics of 800 occupations in Minnesota. He also will briefly explain his econometric work improving the measurement of labor supply and demand in Minnesota. Refreshments will be served before the lecture.
