Our 2017 Chevrolet Bolt EV (electric vehicle) will be on hand for demonstrations and ride-alongs. Refreshments will also be served.



BACKGROUND INFO

As more and more electric cars move about the country, the need for charging stations - particularly fast charging stations - continues to grow. The WCROC, Morris, recently installed a DC Fast Charging Station (DCFC); this means an electric car can charge 6.5 times faster than at a level 2 charger. Our Chevrolet Bolt EV can charge in under an hour with a DCFC, versus 6 hours on a level 2 charger. The same charge would take more than 2 days in a standard 110 volt outlet.

The WCROC is currently the only DCFC station in west central Minnesota. Consumers may plug in their electric vehicles free of charge. To find a map of charging stations around the globe, <u>PlugShare</u> or <u>Greenlots</u>.



ANDREW WALESCH: Kicks off concert series #16 at Central Square in Glenwood MN on Saturday April 21st 2018 at 7:30pm. The Andrew Walesch Big Band will pay tribute to the man still called The Voice and Chairman of the Board with a series of concerts this year called "100 Years of Sinatra."

An emerging artist on the Minnesota music scene, Andrew Walesch maintains a very active performance schedule. Whether recording jingles, producing shows, composing and arranging, or singing as a solo artist and with big bands all over the Midwest, Andrew is known for his unique approach to *The Great American Songbook*. Andrew has recorded two albums and has sung and played on the stage of The Bluebird Cafe in Nashville, The Chicago Theater and dozens of venues all over the Midwest. He also has appeared on the nationally syndicated broadcast *Mountain Stage* on National Public Radio. In May of 2010, he graduated with a music degree from St. John's University, Collegeville, MN.

Singer/pianist Andrew Walesch wasn't even in junior high when Frank Sinatra died in 1998. Still, the iconic crooner was one of Walesch's biggest influences. "I listened to him constantly and tried to emulate his singing and his phrasing," Walesch said. "I had everything he recorded by the time I was out of high school."

Why such a fan? That's simple — "he really set the standard for singing," said Walesch, 26, a graduate of Cathedral High School and St. John's University. "He chose the best songs, and delivered them with grace and art and sophistication. Any good singer should have a serious respect for what he did for music."

You will hear dozens of your favorites including, "That's Life," Nice 'n' Easy," "You Make Me Feel So Young," "Fly Me To The Moon," "New York, New York," "My Way" and many, many others. Join Andrew Walesch and his big band, filled with many Twin Cities' big band and jazz legends, as they take you through this journey in time. 



All pieces must have a prairie related theme and be original to the artist.

Pieces deemed not original to the artist will be removed. There is no time requirement as to when a piece was created.

MEDIA & GENRE

All genres, including paintings, drawings, photographs, fiber, hand-pulled prints, fired clay, mixed media, sculpture, etc., will be considered and non-landscape work is encouraged.

CONDITION AND SEEE

Oil paintings must be fully dry and framed. Drawings, prints, photography and watercolors must be framed and under glass. (Canvases exempt) 2-D pieces must be ready to hang, including wires. ID labels must be attacked to the back upper laft hand corner of each work or wherever feasible on sculptures. 2-D pieces must not exceed 240 inches (overall perimeter measurement), frame included. Sculptures must not weigh more than 100 pounds or exceed 4 feet in either direction.

The entry fee is \$5.00 for each piece to be juried, with a maximum of six entries per artist.

Sales will be handled through the SCHS gift shop and a 30% commission collected for all pieces sold as a result of the exhibition. All scheduling, freight costs and pick-up charges will be the responsibility of the artist.

LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

Artists must make their own arrangements for insuring their pieces if they wish. Return freight costs and scheduling of delivery and pickups according to the exhibit calendar is the responsibility of the artist.
